## APPLICATION DEADLINE IS MARCH 15, 2009

- Applications received or completed after March 15, 2009 will not be guaranteed full consideration.
- Most applicants will be notified of the admissions committee's decision in April 2009.
- Students select the full-time day, part-time day or part-time evening program at the time of application.
- Approximately 150 students are in the entering class.

### FULL-TIME DAY PROGRAM

- Three-year, day program
- Classes meet Monday through Friday, generally between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- 12–16 credit hours per semester
- \$18,000 per year for Nevada residents for 2009-2010
- \$30,000 per year for non-residents for 2009-2010

### PART-TIME DAY PROGRAM

- Four-year, day program
- Classes meet Monday through Friday, generally between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- 8–11 credit hours per semester
- \$643/credit hour for Nevada residents for 2009-2010
- \$1071/credit hour for non-residents for 2009-2010

### PART-TIME EVENING PROGRAM

- Four-year, evening program
- Classes meet Monday through Thursday, generally between the hours of 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.
- 8–11 credit hours per semester
- \$643/credit hour for Nevada residents for 2009-2010
- \$1071/credit hour for non-residents for 2009-2010

### THOMAS & MACK LEGAL CLINIC

Opened in 2000, the innovative interdisciplinary Thomas & Mack Legal Clinic gives student attorneys the chance to work under faculty supervision with UNLV graduate social work, education, and psychology students to provide high-quality representation to children, youths, and adults in trouble.

### SALTMAN CENTER FOR CONFLICT RESOLUTION

The Saltman Center for Conflict Resolution, established in 2003, hosts scholarly presentations and other special events on such topics as theories of conflict, substantive analysis of specific conflicts that affect the public interests, and methods of conflict avoidance and resolution. In addition, a practice component provides hands-on experience to law students.

### LAWYERING PROCESS PROGRAM

The nationally recognized Lawyering Process Program emphasizes professionalism while giving students the opportunity to explore the relationship between legal analysis and a variety of lawyering skills, including legal writing in advocacy and transactional contexts, research strategies, oral advocacy, client interviewing, counseling, and negotiation.
