Father Link is the Joseph A. Matson Dean Emeritus and Professor at ND Law School. At the time he became Dean Emeritus, his tenure of more than 24 years as dean was the longest of any law dean in the United States. He also serves as a director of the World Law Institute. He serves as the deputy vice chancellor (academic) and provost for St. Augustine Coolege of South Africa. He also served as the president of the International Centre for Healing and the Law. In 1990, he took on the additional responsibility of serving as the founding president and vice chancellor of the UND, Australia. He continues on leave from the Chicago law firm of Winston & Strawn, where he was a senior partner. He also served as a trial attorney and branch chief with the federal government during the Kennedy administration. Father Link is a noted teacher, scholar, and lecturer in the fields of applied ethics, professional responsibility, professionalism, law practice, and legal education. He serves as the chair and director of the World Law Institute, as a director of the Miracle of Nazareth International Foundation, as a director of the Future of Russia Foundation, on the advisory board of The Woodrow Wilson Center for Scholars, and numerous other professional, charitable, civic, and educational organization boards. He was a co-founder of the South Bend Center for the Homeless.
