Duties and Responsibilities of Board Members

The Boyd School of Law Alumni Chapter is a group of dedicated alumni who provide leadership, input and programming to benefit alumni, current students, and the law school. Board terms are for three years, and meetings are held the first Tuesday of each month (excluding December), at 6:00 pm at the law school.

Leadership

- Stay informed about what is going on at Boyd Law School and UNLV. Periodically review the law school's website, think strategically, be prepared to contribute at the meeting, and follow up timely on requests made and/or responsibilities assigned.
- Exhibit the highest level of judgment based on what is best for the Boyd School of Law as a whole and for the advancement of legal education.
- Cultivate relationships with law school deans, faculty, staff, students, campus leaders, and fellow Boyd graduates.
- Encourage outstanding prospective students to apply and attend Boyd School of Law.

Participation

- Regularly attend monthly board meetings. To fully engage in the discussion and board business, you are expected to attend meetings in person. Conference call participation may be arranged if you live outside of Las Vegas or you are out of town on business. Due to the functions of our board, lack of in-person participation may jeopardize the completion of a board member's term.
- Pay your own expenses incurred in attending meetings.
- Attend Boyd School of Law activities and events such as reunions, local alumni events, Spring Fling, graduations, and student networking events.
- Offer to be a guest speaker, judge, or mentor.
- Volunteer to host events at your firm or attend law school events and serve as hosts.

Development

- Be a dues paying member, preferably as a life member, but at least as an active annual member of the UNLV Alumni Association's Boyd Law School chapter. *See link for membership level options.*
- Encourage and solicit other Boyd Law graduates to become members of the UNLV Alumni Association on the behalf of Boyd Law School Chapter. When possible, identify volunteers for the Association and direct them to the appropriate staff.
